Breeding Codes

OBSERVED (Ob):
X - Species observed in its breeding season (no breeding evidence)
POSSIBLE (Po):
H - Species observed in breeding season in suitable nesting habitat
S - Singing male(s) present, or breeding calls heard, in suitable nesting habitat in breeding season
PROBABLE (Pr):
M - Multiple singing males (7 or more) found during one visit within the same square
P - Pair observed in suitable nesting habitat in nesting season
T - Permanent territory presumed through registration of territorial song, or occurrence of an adult bird, at the same place, in breeding habitat, on at least two days a week or more apart, during its breeding season
D - Courtship or display, including interaction between a male and a female or 2 males, including courtship feeding or copulation
V - Visiting probable nest site
A - Agitated behaviour or anxiety calls of an adult
B - Brood Patch on adult female or cloacal protuberance on adult male
N - Nest-building or excavation of nest hole by wrens and woodpeckers
CONFIRMED:
NB - Nest-building or carrying nest materials, for all species except wrens and woodpeckers
DD - Distraction display or injury feigning
NU - Used nest or egg shell found (occupied or laid during period of the survey)
FY - Recently fledged young (nidicolous species) or downy young (nidifugous species), including incapable of sustained flight
AE - Adults leaving or entering nest site in circumstances indicating occupied nest
FS - Adult carrying faecal sac
CF - Adult carrying food for young
NE - Nest containing eggs
NY - Nest with young seen or heard
